Amandeep Singh, Home Zero Collective and Jeff Quibell, Falcon Engineering presented on a proposal for reducing GHG Emissions.

The following points were reviewed:

- Concerned about climate changes as there seem to be no affordable solutions
- Vernon Emission Targets – 2025 to 2050
- Problem:
 - Cost of individual heat pump or geothermal system
 - Cost of electricity if higher than natural gas
 - Risk of capital loss when selling home
- Solution: Neighbourhood Factory
- Payment Replacement ideas explored
- Would like to carry out Feasibility Study from funding sources:
 - FCM Green Municipal Fund (up to 80%)
 - City of Vernon - \$25,000
 - BC Hydro - \$20,000
- Project can be done as part of a community initiative and can have system maintenance costs built in
- Environmental & Economic Impacts reviewed.
