BACKGROUND CLLR. QUIRING – NOTICE OF MOTION TRAFFIC BYLAW #5600 AMENDMENTS

#### Rationale:

I have been monitoring the situation regarding numerous recreational vehicles camping along 25<sup>th</sup> avenue, generally west of 43<sup>rd</sup> Street. This situation has been occurring for at least one year and the number of recreational vehicles appears to be increasing. The vehicles include older Class C and Class A motorhomes, recently a large fifth wheel and an assortment of smaller vehicles being used for overnight camping. I have received complaints from businesses in the subject area regarding recreational vehicles partially blocking access to their businesses and of campers using the boulevard as a washroom facility. I have witnessed tractor trailers having difficulty accessing the industrial businesses as a result of the street being crowded with recreational vehicles. It should be noted that some vehicles are deploying slides that extend into the road right-of-way. Current City bylaws prohibit extended parking in one location and require operators to regularly move their vehicles. It is also a concern regarding the apparent roadworthiness of some of the recreational vehicles parked in the area and that potentially unsafe vehicles are travelling on City roads placing others at risk.
