NORTH OKANAGAN TRANSIT FUTURE (8500-12)

THAT Council ratifies and confirms the following resolution adopted at the December 13, 2021 **ACTION PLAN UPDATE** Committee of the Whole meeting of Council:

KAL TIRE PLACE **NORTH - 2022 LACROSSE PROVINCIALS &** SPORT FLOORING (0000)

'THAT Council direct Administration to work with NOMLA and the BCLA to host the 2022 BC Lacrosse Association (BCLA) Bantam Minor Box Lacrosse Provincial Championships for July 14-17, using the concrete floors at Kal Tire Place, Kal Tire Place North and the NorVal Centre in Armstrong as per the memorandum dated December 6, 2021 from the Director. Recreation Services titled "Kal Tire Place North - 2022 Lacrosse Provincials & Sport Flooring";

AND FURTHER, that Council direct Administration to remove the ice from Kal Tire North in order to host the 2022 BC Lacrosse Association (BCLA) Provincial Bantam Minor Box Lacrosse Championships for July 14-17 on the concrete floor at an estimated cost of \$6,000:

AND FURTHER, that Council direct Administration to install the ice in the Priest Valley Arena, if possible and if feasible, in order to try and accommodate the summer ice user groups that would be displaced from Kal Tire Place North;

AND FURTHER, that Council direct Administration to notify all affected summer ice user groups that the ice in Kal Tire Place North will be removed between July 9 and August 1, 2022 in order to host the 2022 BC Lacrosse Association (BCLA) Bantam Minor Box Lacrosse Provincial Championships and that, if possible and feasible, ice will be installed in the Priest Valley Arena in order to accommodate their bookings;

SUBJECT: FEES AND CHARGES BYLAW #3909 - REFUSE COLLECTION AND

RECYCLING

At the August 16, 2021 In Camera meeting, Council directed Administration to finalize negotiations with the preferred service provider (Emterra Environmental Group) for waste collection services (Attachment 1). With the exception of commercial recycling, negotiations are now complete. Administration is still in the process of negotiating commercial recycling and will provide Council an update when finalized. The new waste collection service is scheduled to commence May 1, 2022.

The service model selected by Council included the change from weekly residential garbage collection to bi-weekly automated residential garbage collection with the inclusion of weekly automated collection of residential organics and yard waste. The following additional services are also included in the solid waste collection contract and remain unchanged:

- Weekly commercial garbage collection
- Weekly commercial recycling (still under negotiation)
- Spring and fall leaf pick-up
- Adopt A Road

It should be noted that the spring chipping and Christmas tree disposal programs are included in the residential fee, but are not part of this waste collection contract. Early in 2022, Administration will release a comprehensive public information campaign to advise residents of the changes coming to solid waste services.

Amendments to Schedule A Section 15 of the Fees and Charges Bylaw #3909 required to support the change in service are detailed in Attachment 2 and include:

- Reduction in cost for Residential Garbage Collection 120L or 240L Cart. This is due to a reduction in pick up frequency is from weekly to bi-weekly.
- Reduction in Residential Garbage Collection Extended Service (refuse collection onto private property and available to residents with a disability) - 120L or 240L Cart. This is due to a reduction in pick up frequency from weekly to bi-weekly.
- Addition of Residential Organics and Yard Waste Collection 120L or 240L Cart. This is a new fee for organics and yard waste collection.
- Addition of Residential Organics and Yard Waste Collection Extended Service (refuse collection onto private property and available to residents with a disability) - 120L or 240L Cart. This is a new Fee for organics and yard waste extended service.

- Addition of *Automated Cart Replacement*. This is a new fee required to facilitate the replacement of carts.
- Removal of Yard Recycling. This fee is no longer required and has been included into the new residential organics and yard waste fee.

The City was successful in obtaining a grant of \$936k from CleanBC to support the residential organics collection program. The province released the information regarding this grant to the public on December 2. The proposed fees and charges for waste collection services have been reduced to account for this additional revenue.

Prior to the inclusion of organics collection, residential waste collection services included Residential Garbage Collection fees and Yard Recycling fees at a total quarterly cost of \$46.30 (\$185.20 annually). Following the change to organics collection, residential fees will now include Residential Garbage Collection – 120L or 240L and Residential Organics and Yard Waste Collection – 120L or 240L Cart, at a total quarterly cost of \$50.68 (\$202.72 annually). The cost for commercial garbage collection under the new contract remains unchanged.

The new fee structure will start on January 24, 2022. This is to facilitate the Council approved expenditure of up to \$110,000 for a two-year period to establish and recruit a temporary position to assist with program implementation starting January 1, 2022.
