

## EVACUATION ALERT RESCIND - PARTIAL City of Vernon

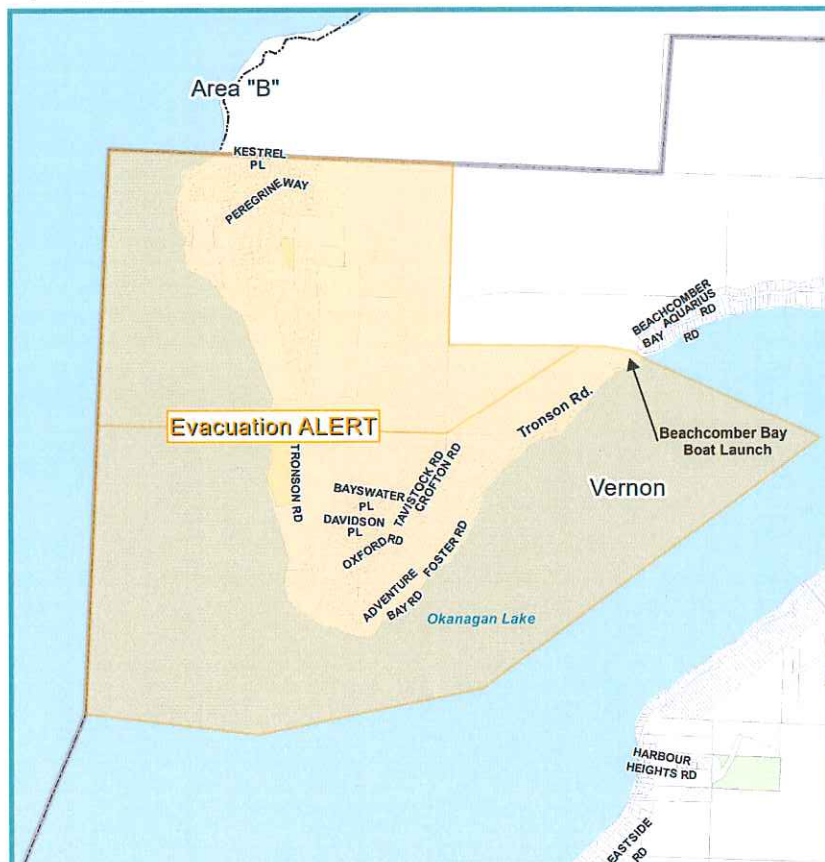

The Evacuation Alerts, pursuant to Section 6.1 of the City of Vernon *Emergency Program Bylaw #5645*, issued at August 6, ve2021 to portions of the City of Vernon have been partially rescinded.

**Evacuation Alerts remains in effect at this time. The areas that remain under Evacuation Alert include the neighbourhoods of:**

- Canadian Lakeview Estates in its entirety;
- Adventure Bay in its entirety; and
- 8125 to 9280 Tronson Road.

The areas that continue to be under Evacuation Alert are shown below:




The Evacuation Alert remains in place to prepare you to evacuate your premises or property should it be necessary. Residents will be given as much advance notice as possible prior to evacuation; however you may receive limited notice due to changing conditions.

### **FOR THOSE PROPERTIES STILL UNDER EVACUATION ALERT: WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:**

- Locate all family members and designate a meeting area outside the evacuation area, should an Evacuation Order be called while separated.
- Pack essential items such as government-issued ID, medications, eyeglasses, valuable papers (e.g. insurance, credit, and mortgage information), immediate care needs for dependents and, if time and space permits, keepsakes for quick departure.
- Residents should arrange accommodations with family or friends before an Evacuation Order as there is minimal to no availability of commercial accommodation.
- Hook up all recreational vehicles and trailers
- Check on neighbours and work together as communities.
- Individuals with transportation issues or facing barriers to mobility and movement should be alerted and a plan developed. These individuals should consider evacuating in advance of an actual order.
- Move livestock to a safe area (if possible).
- Arrange transportation for all your household members. Ensure all personal vehicles are fully fueled.
- Arrange accommodation for all members of the residence with friends and family, if possible.
- Have an evacuation plan in place and communicate that plan with people living in the residence and neighbours.
- When an Evacuation Order is issued please implement your plan and leave the area immediately.

For those residents and businesses located in the area that is no longer within the Evacuation Alert area, an Evacuation Alert may need to be reissued for additional areas; however, if that is deemed necessary, the Evacuation Alert process will re-commence.

### **FOR THOSE PROPERTIES NO LONGER UNDER EVACUATION ALERT WHAT YOU SHOULD DO:**

- Remain aware and informed of the current White Rock wildfire.
